Young Negro Electrocuted For Double Murder

Columbia, S. C., June 16 (UP)— Fourteen-year-old George Stinney was electrocuted this morning. He was the youngest on record to die in the South Carolina chair.

As he went to his death, the little Negro carried a Bible, and answered only "No, sir," when asked if he had anything to say. Relatives of the two little girls whom Stinney admitted killing thronged the death cell.

Another Negro—Bruce Hamilton, 21—was electrocuted shortly after Stinney. He protested his innocence to the end. Hamilton had been convicted in Spartanburg on a statutory charge.
