Robert C. Byrd, Democratic candidate for the House of Representatives, called new charges that he was a member of the Ku Klux Klan in 1946 a "smear campaign" on the part of the Republican Party.

Byrd denied any recollection of a letter purportedly written by him six years ago proclaiming his desire for renewed Klan activity in West Virginia. "I do not recall having written this letter in 1946, nor do I recall having had any connection with the Klan after 1943 as has already been said (last May), he declared today.

Byrd was accused at a Republican rally in the Courthouse last night by Robert J. Ashworth, Republican county executive committee chairman, of writing a letter in April, 1946, to Dr. Samuel Green, imperial wizard of the Klan, suggesting the mame of a state organizer.
