

## Secretary of School Board Resigns Post in Riverdale

RIVERDALE — The Board of Education disclosed Friday that its secretary, Mrs. Shirley Shaw, has presented her resignation effective Sept. 30, and that it was accepted with regret.

Mrs. Shaw, who started in the system four years ago as school secretary and then became board secretary in April, 1969, is following her predecessor, Mrs. Edith Welcher, and will be working in the school board secretary's office in Pequannock.

To fill her position, the board has appointed Mrs. E. Lynn DiAngelis from Oct. 1 to June 30 at a salary of \$6,300.

Mrs. DiAngelis is the wife of Councilman Michael DiAngelis, who is also the borough's Director of Recreation. Her appointment was approved by a five-to-one vote of the board with Robert Tintle casting the dissenting vote.

### Other Appointments

Other appointments include: Richard Watt of Bloomingdale, a college student, as part-time custodian to work four hours a night at \$2.25 per hour, and Nicholas Delre of Garfield to teach the multi-handicapped class. A psychology major with education courses at Seton Hall University, Delre has been discharged as a captain in the U.S. Army after three years service.

Mrs. Elizabeth Warren, who moved into the area from Texas will be the new speech teacher working in the school two days a week.

The board has adopted an extensive policy pertaining to school personnel which the teachers asked for. In spells out in detail such areas as recruitment, assignment of duty, physical examinations, salary, lunch period, tutoring, hearings and tenure. The policy was drawn up by Board Attorney Herbert Irwin.

### Lunch Cost Hike

The cost of school lunches will be raised a nickel from .30 to .35 with the weekly meal ticket priced at \$1.50 instead of \$1.25.

Milk will go up one cent from .04 to .05 and ice cream from .10 to .15. These prices will be effective Sept. 14.

The cafeteria will be in operation at the old prices next Thursday and Friday when school opens.

The board has approved an application for Title I funds in the NDEA for \$4,000 for fiscal 1971. The monies will be used for supplemental instruction.

Bids will be received Sept. 10 for the repair of the old roof on the 1930 school building. They will be tabulated by the school administration so that the contract can be awarded at the Sept. 16 board meeting.
