

Inmate Wed At Somers

SOMERS — A man convicted in the 1982 "demon murder" case married his longtime girlfriend Wednesday at Somers state prison, said a spokeswoman for the state Department of Correction.

Arne Cheyenne Johnson, 23, married Deborah Glatzel, 30, said the spokeswoman, Connie Wilks. Glatzel obtained a marriage license from the town clerk's office in Somers, Wilks said.

Johnson was convicted of manslaughter in November 1981 and sentenced to a 10- to 20-year term. He is eligible for parole in seven years, Wilks said.

Johnson was convicted of stabbing Alan Bono to death in February 1981. He said the devil told him to do it. His defense attorneys tried to prove that Johnson was possessed by demons in July 1980 because of his close association with a 12-year-old Brookfield boy they said was possessed.
