

Will meet with Queen later

Trudeau, Thatcher discuss issues

LONDON — Canadian Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau went directly to 10 Downing Street for a working luncheon with British Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher when he arrived here today.

Thatcher met Trudeau at the door and asked to meet his son Justin. After she greeted the eight-year-old Justin, the two prime ministers went in for their meeting.

How well they get on could influence key issues, one being bringing the Canadian constitution, a British act, to Canada. During lunch, Trudeau was expected to review the recent Quebec referendum results as well as constitutional, bilateral and north-south development issues.

Trudeau was to go to Buckingham Palace in the afternoon with Justin, to meet the Queen.

He was also expected to raise constitutional questions with the Queen.

Trudeau is half way through a 10-day European tour which opened in Venice at the seven-nation economic summit and ends in Oslo, Norway, Monday.

In Rome Tuesday, Trudeau and Italian Premier Francesco Cossiga agreed to press ahead with long-delayed plans for Italy to buy Canadian-built Candu nuclear reactors and discussed plans for Italy to buy coal produced in Alberta and British Columbia to generate electrical energy.

Following an agreement signed in November 1977 with Atomic Energy of Canada Ltd., Italy had planned to buy the two Candu reactors to power plants on the islands of Sicily and Sardinia. The value of the deal
